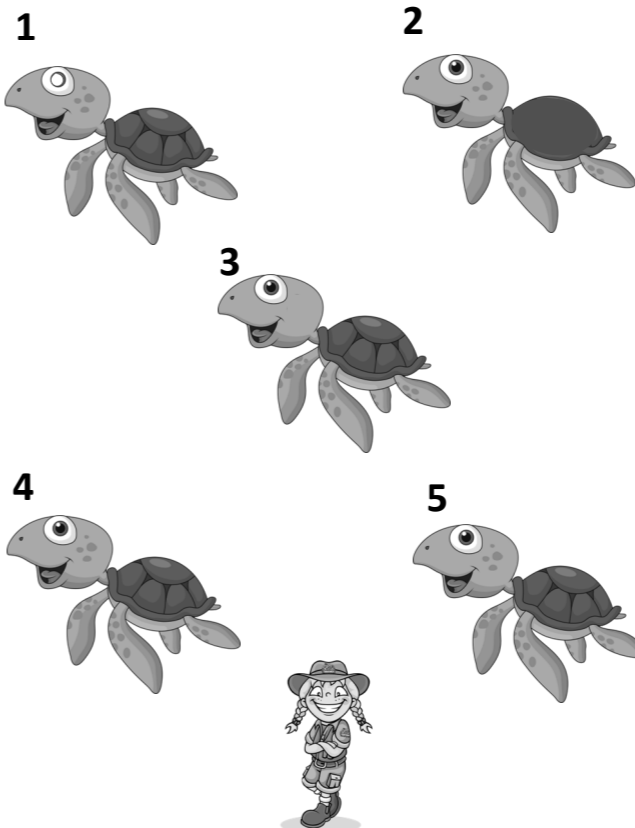

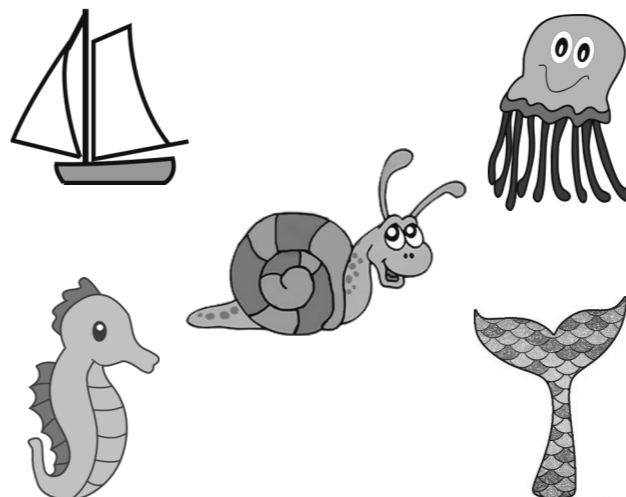

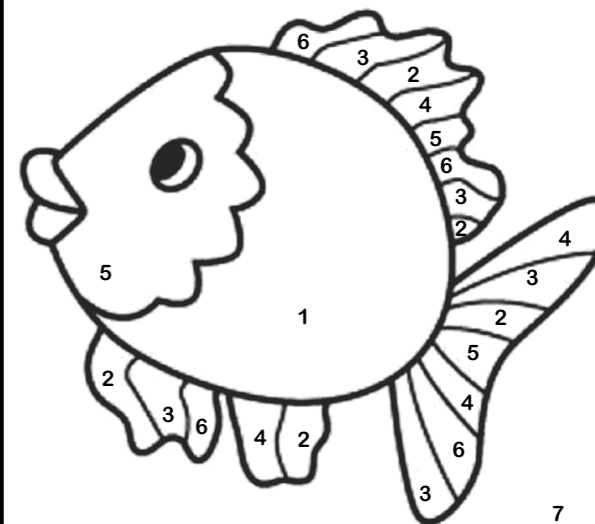
PICTURE RHYMES

When they arrived, Ranger Kai waited for them in a boat on the shore. He beckoned them over and everyone climbed in.

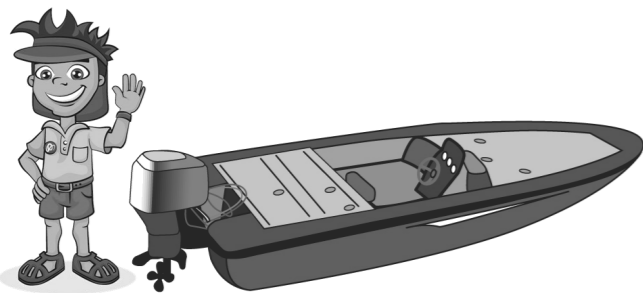
The boat engine roared to life and sped across the water.

'Let's gather what's left of the net,' Ranger Tabatha said. 'And we'll take it to the tackle shop for recycling.'

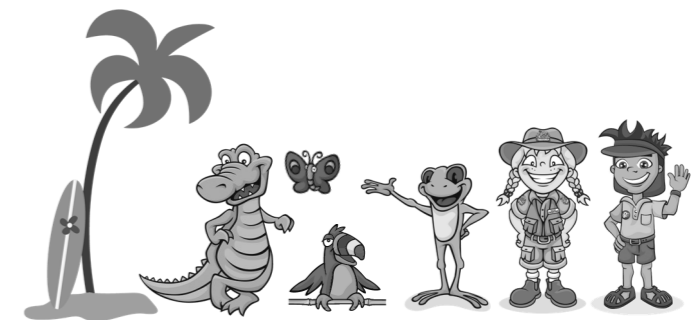
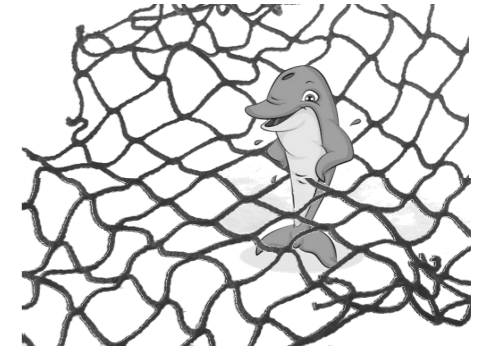
The rangers climbed back into the boat.

Ranger Kai smiled as the boat engine roared to life and they sped back towards the shore.



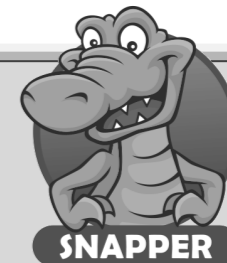
